- 3. Recommend expanded services and incorporate trauma informed care for CASA children who have had adverse childhood experiences and have not received equitable care and support
- 4. Practice and encourage transparent, culturally, and emotionally intelligent communication
- 5. Bring additional and diverse voices to the table to influence our policies and practices
- 6. Address assumptions that interfere with inclusive and equitable outcomes for CASA children
- 7. Pursue cultural intelligence for employees, board of directors, and volunteers by participating in learning opportunities
- 8. Expand CASA's network to include individuals and organizations who value equity, diversity, and inclusion and who reflect the culture and identities of children served
- 9. Use quantitative and qualitative data to measure CASA of Kent County's progress toward diversity, equity, and inclusion
- 10. Understand each CASA child's unique qualities and demonstrate respect for their traditions, culture, and values
- 11. Work in partnership with community stakeholders to address the community's issues of racial disproportionality in the child welfare system
